## **National Bureau of Statistics overview**

The National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) is the official statistical agency of the Republic of South Sudan. It is mandated to collect, analyze and disseminate all official economic, environmental, social and demographic statistics. It is charged with conducting all censuses and major surveys within the Republic of South Sudan, as well as establishing statistical standards for all data collection. It is also tasked with monitoring the impact of public policy and tracking South Sudan's progress on key development indicators.

The National Bureau of Statistics has carried out a number of large high-profile data collection activities. Most notable among these was the 2008 Population and Housing Census. NBS also conducted the 2006 and 2010 rounds of the Sudan Household Health Survey (SHHS), which generated health indicators such as child malnutrition and mortality, and the National Baseline Household Survey (NBHS) in 2009, which generated poverty estimates. NBS produces regular statistical bulletins on consumer price index (CPI) inflation, agro-meteorology and food security. This is the fifth annual Statistical Yearbook.

Figure 1.1: Overview of Administrative Boundaries

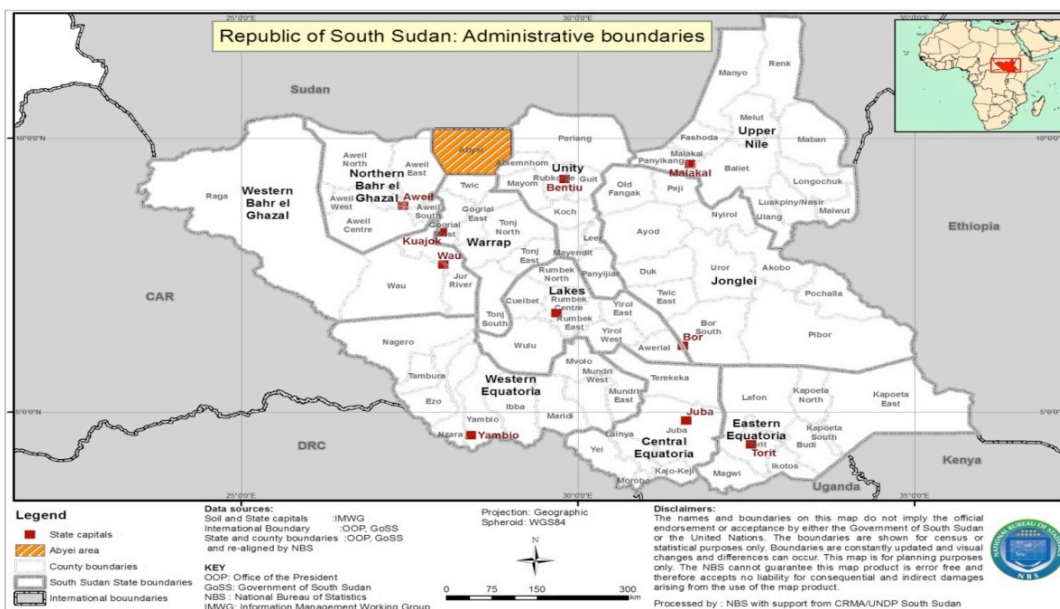


Figure 1.2: Geographic Information

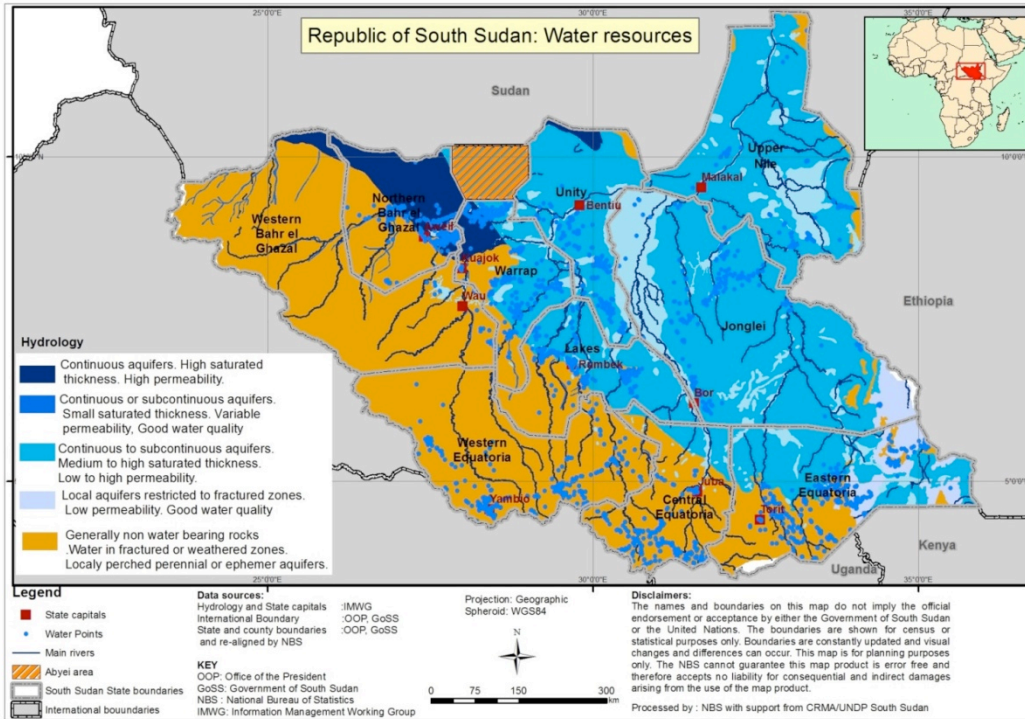


Figure 1.3: Geological Information

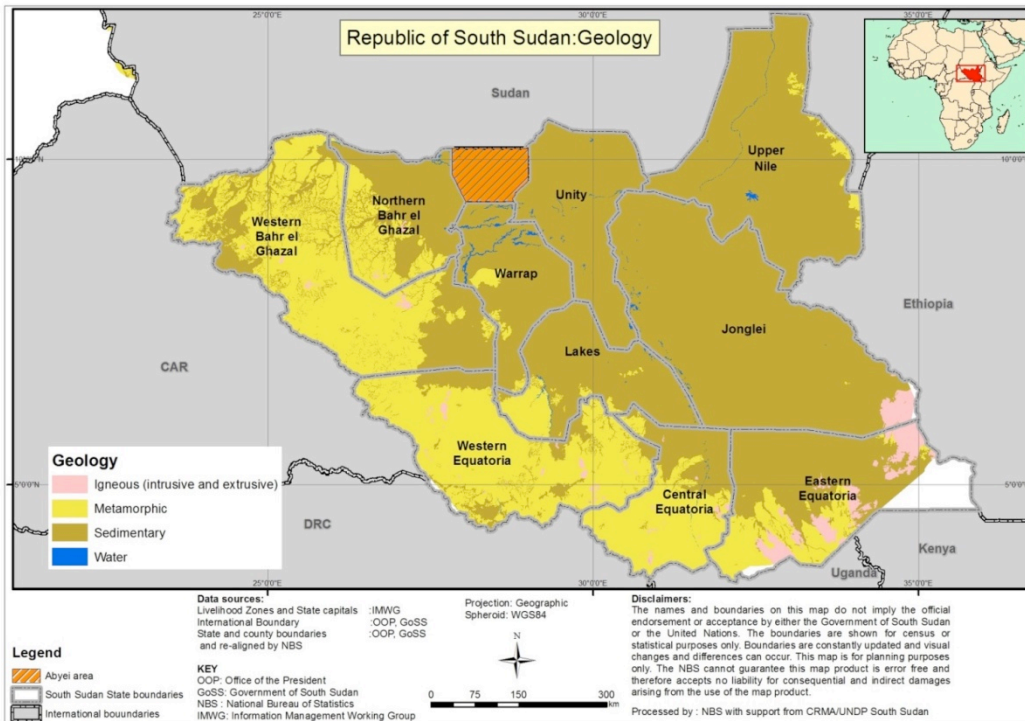




Figure 1.4: Hydrogeological map

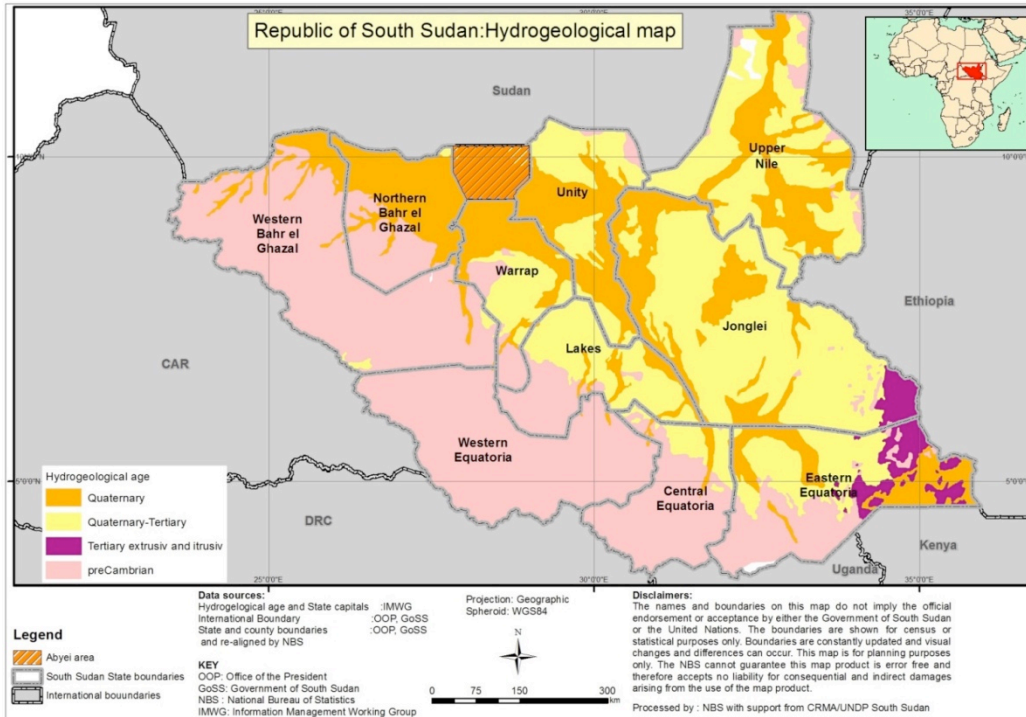


Figure 1.5: Soil and Land Cover

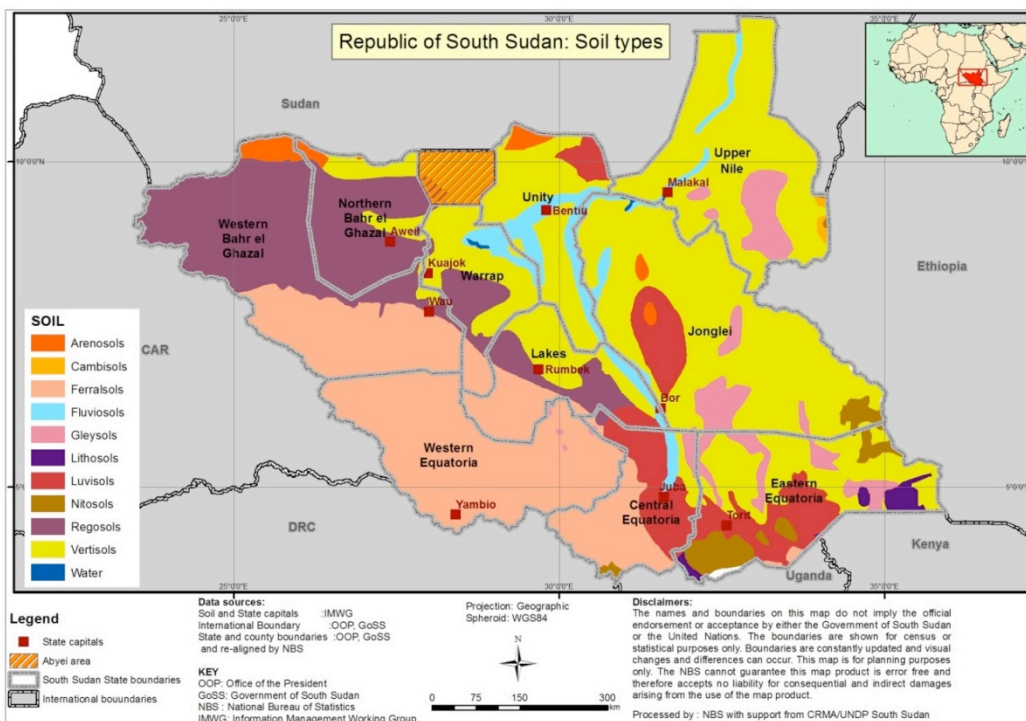


Figure 1.6: Area under forest reserves, national parks and game reserves. Number and hectare

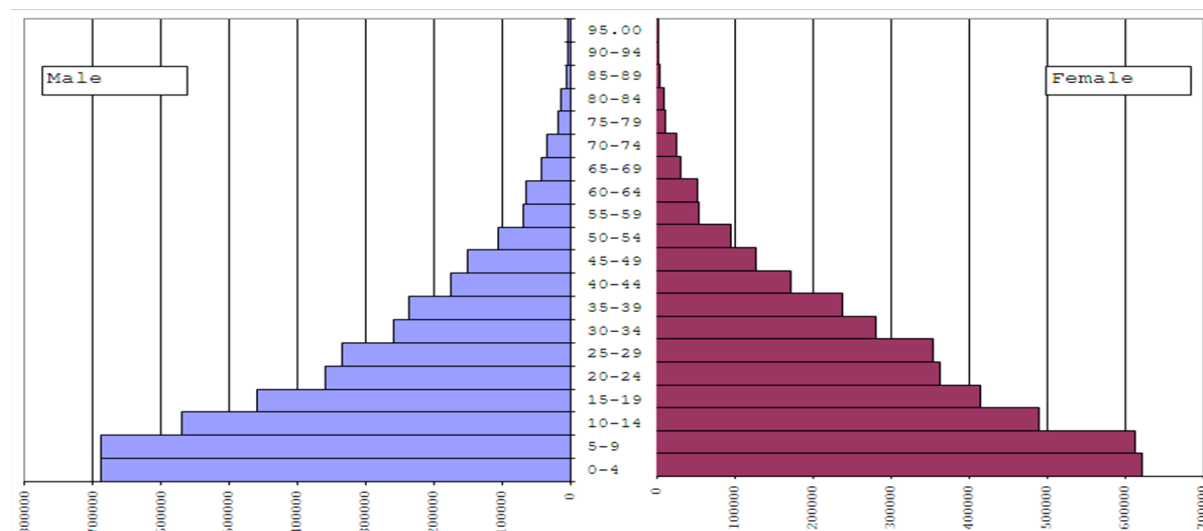

Figure 2.2: Percentage distribution of population of South Sudan by state

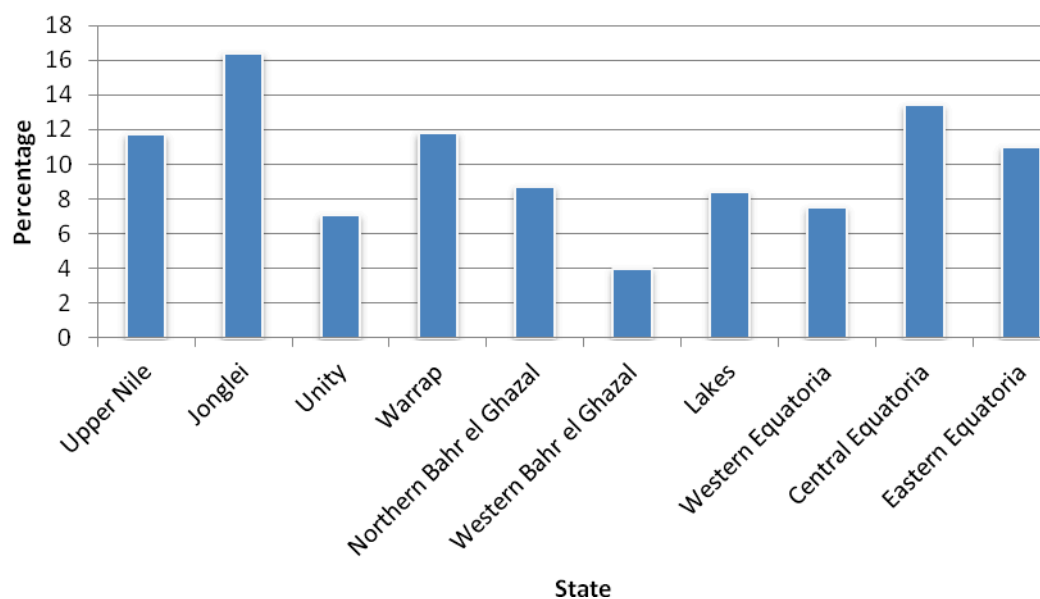

Figure 2.3: The percentage distribution of older persons by state

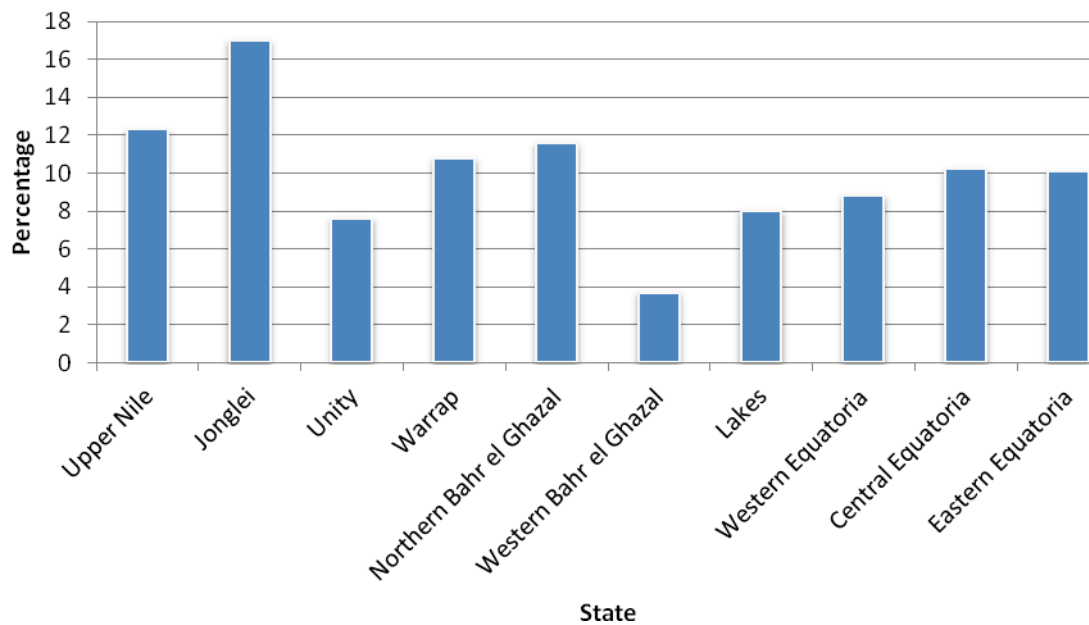

Figure 2.4: The percentage distribution of children under 18 years by state

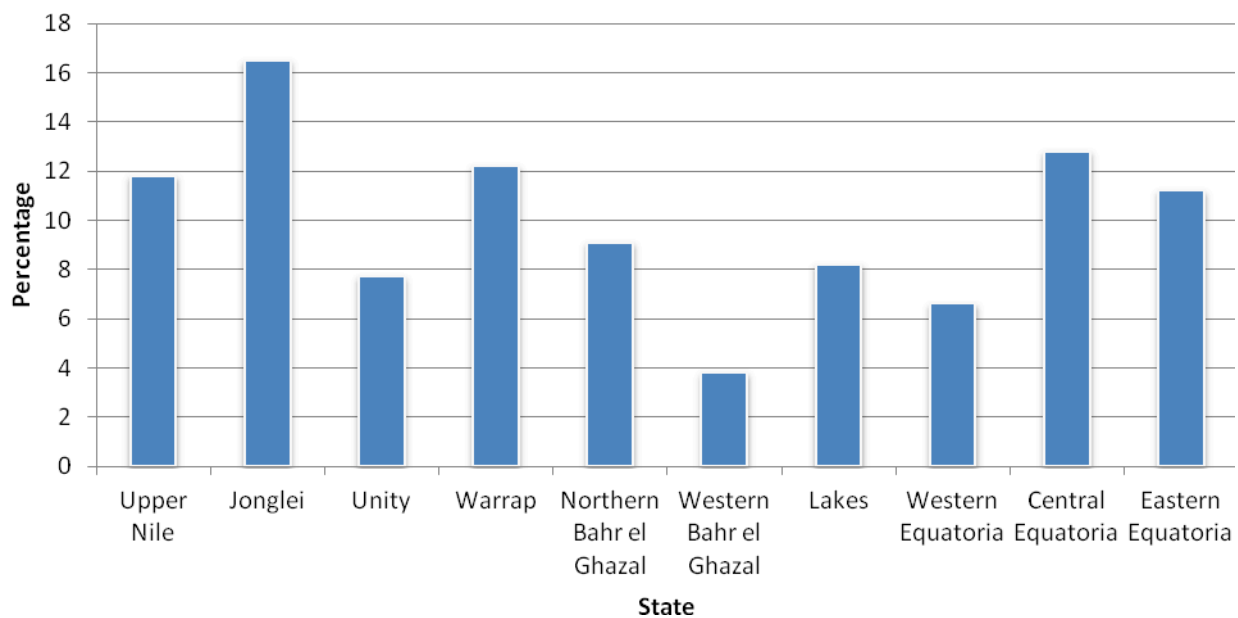


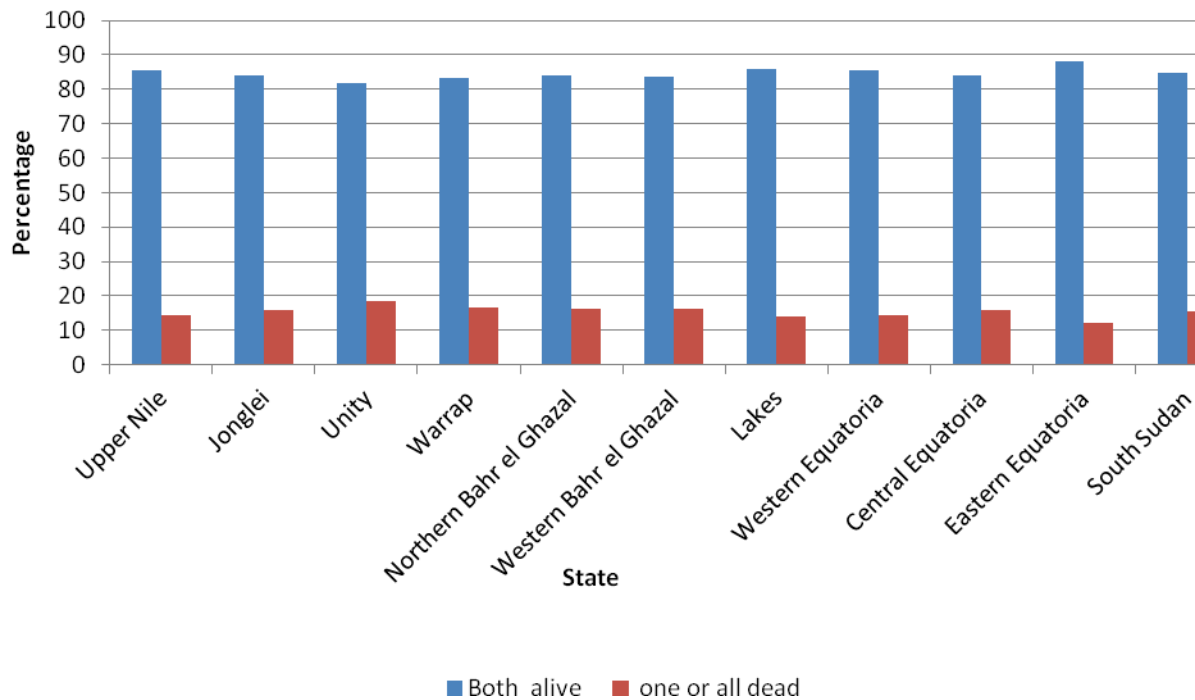

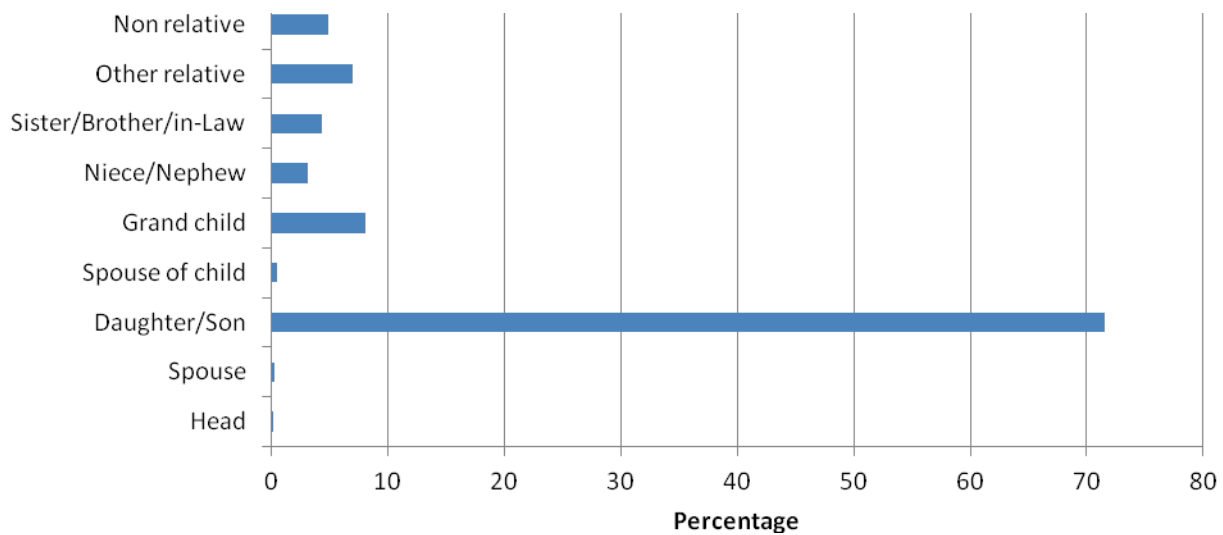

Figure 2.7: Percentage distribution of children by age at first marriage by sex

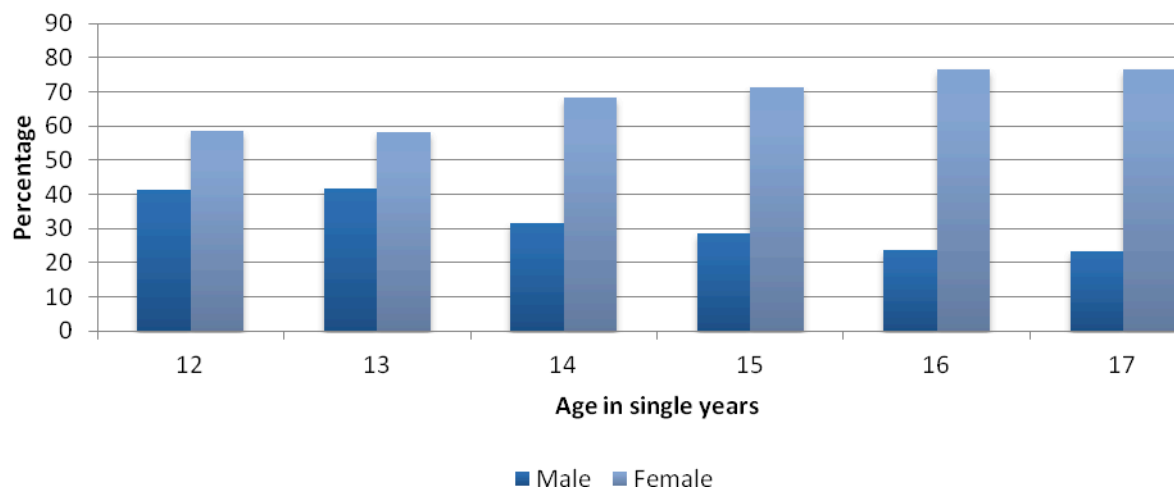

Figure 2.8: Percentage distribution of girls 12-17 years by whether they have given birth by state

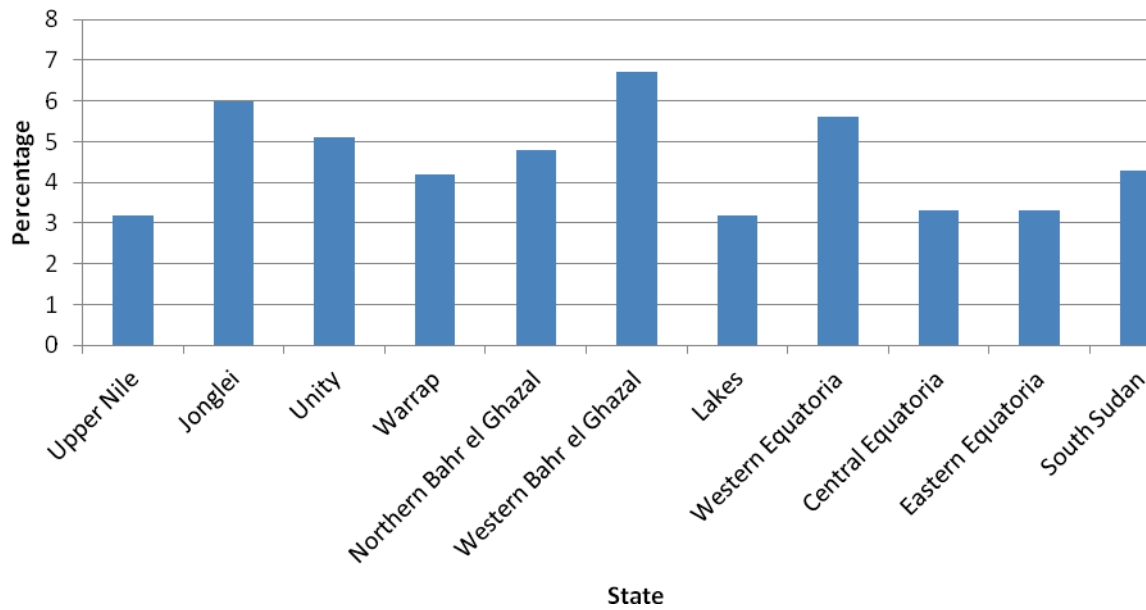

Figure 2.9: Percentage distribution of children by disability status by state

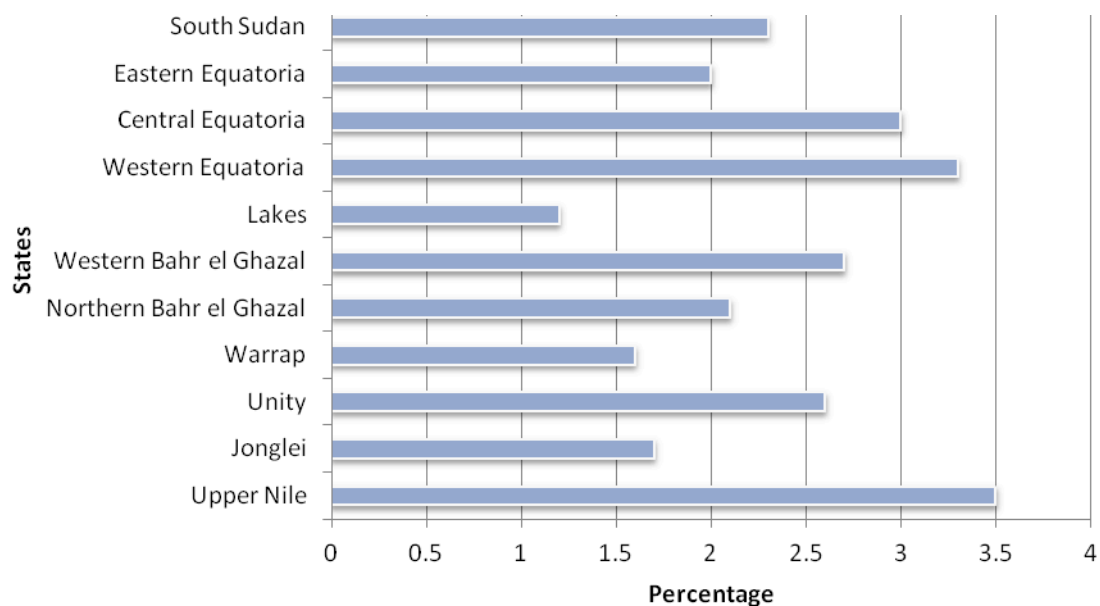

Figure 2.10: Percentage distribution of children (0-17) by type of disability

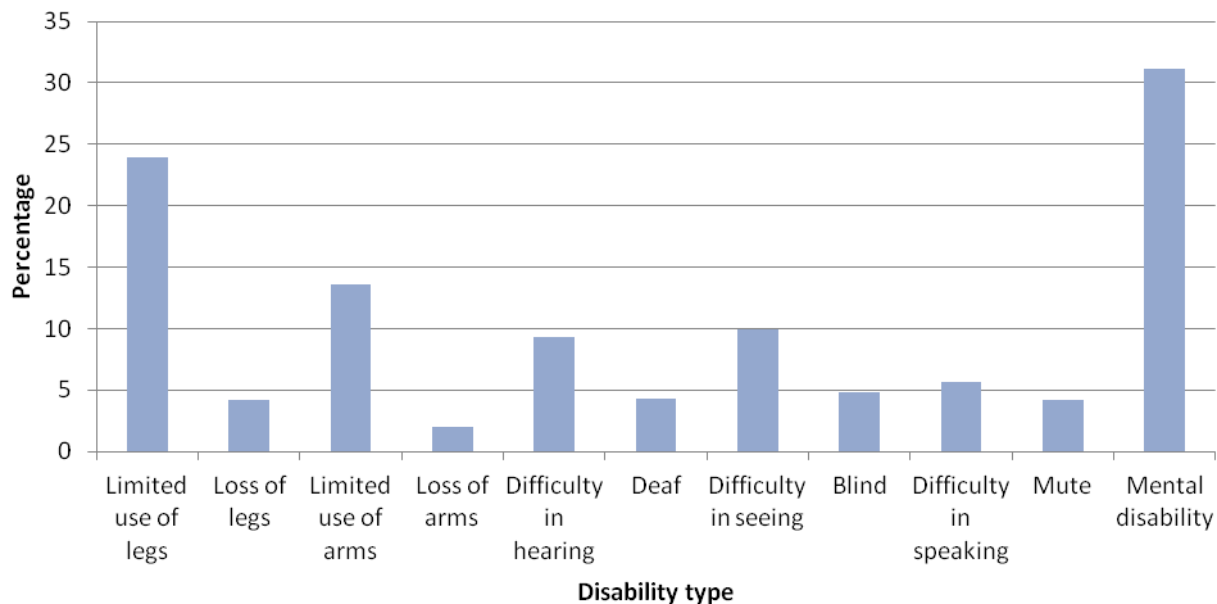

Figure 2.11: Percentage distribution of disability by type

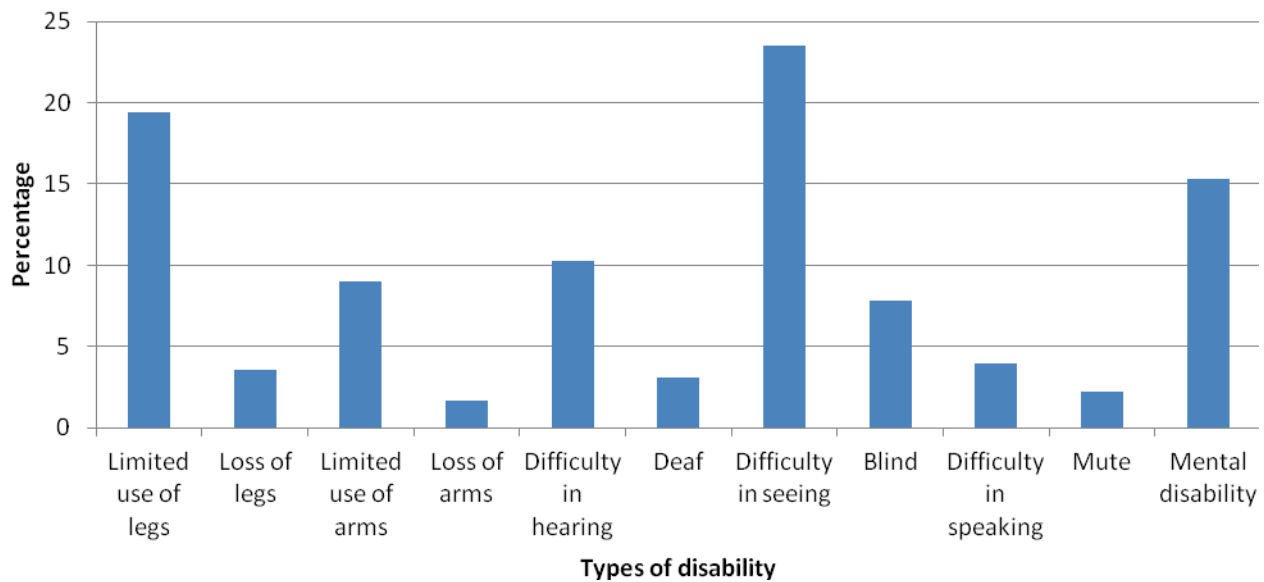
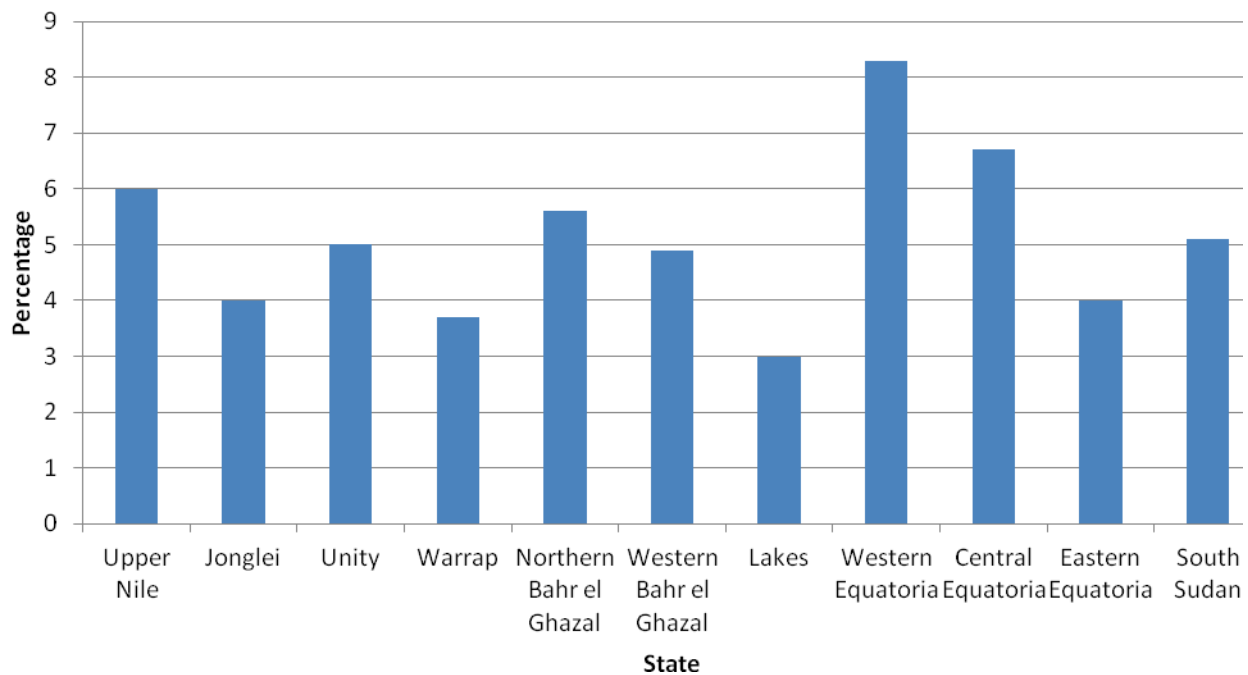

Figure 2.13: Percentage distribution of the population by type of disability by sex

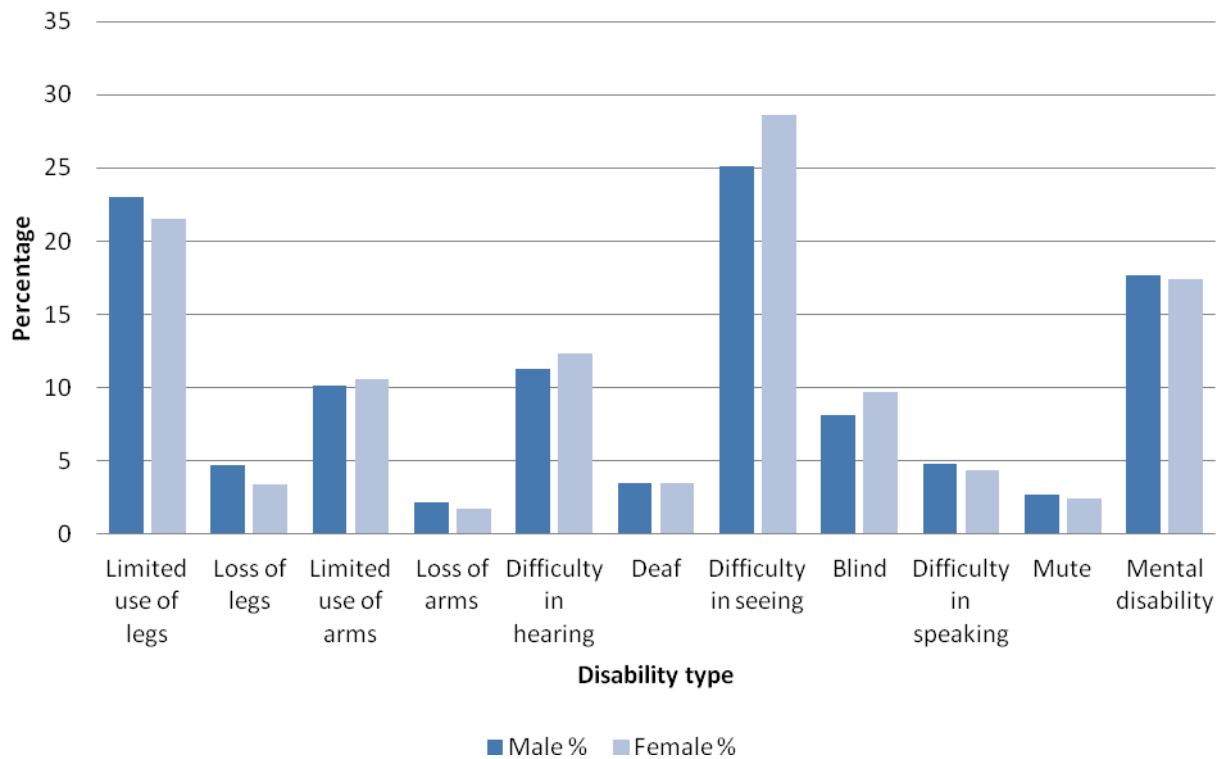

Figure 2.14: Percentage distribution of older persons by state by sex

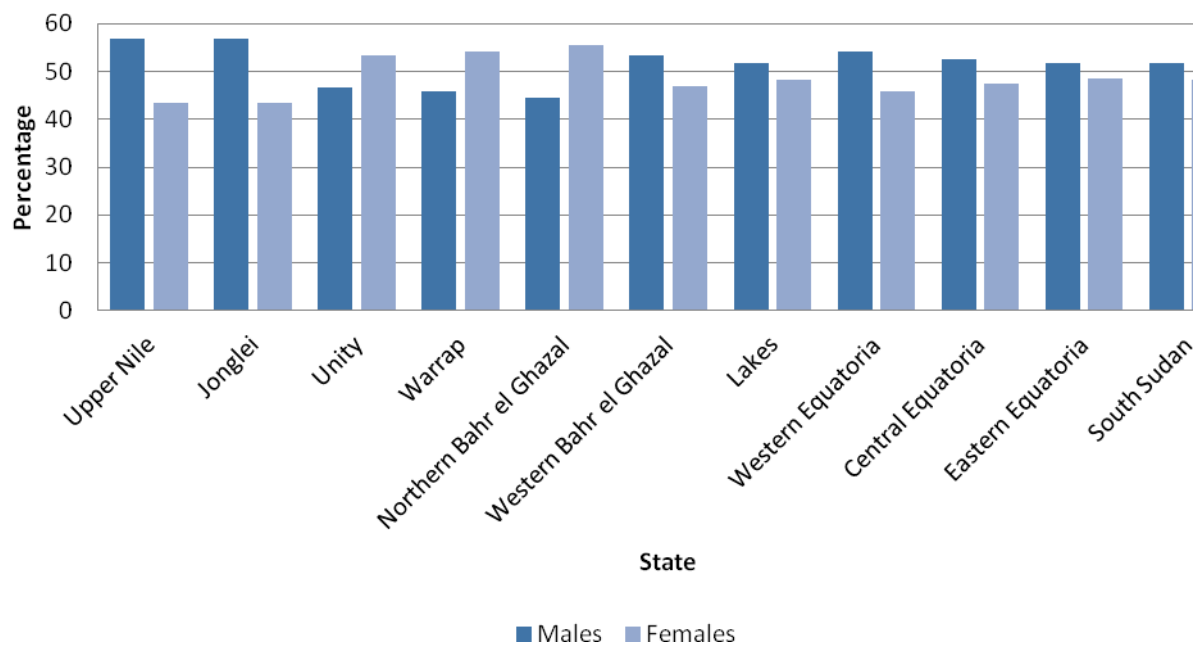

Figure 2.15: Percentage distribution of the older persons by living arrangement

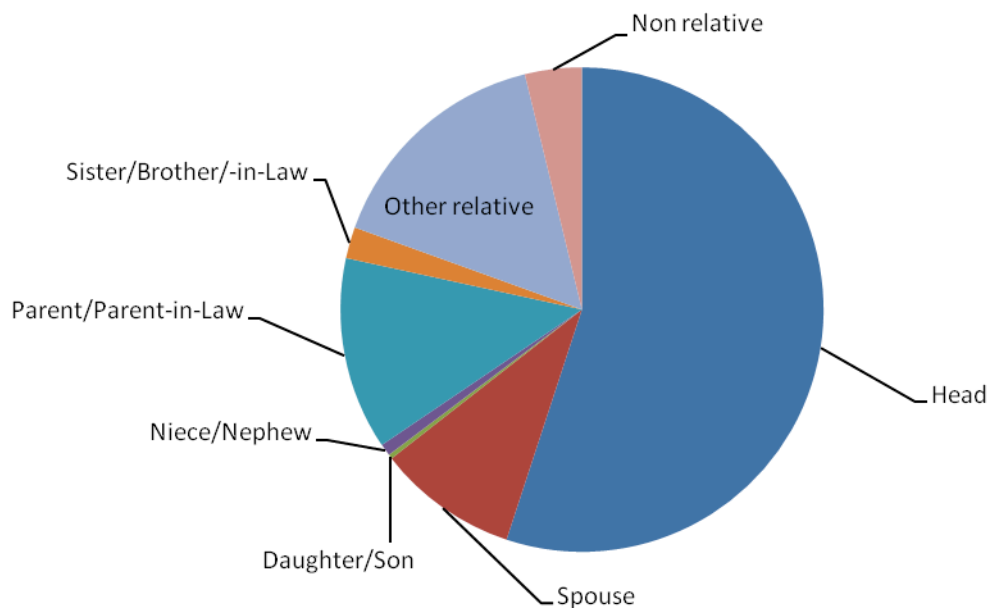

Figure 2.16: Percentage distribution of older persons by living arrangement by sex

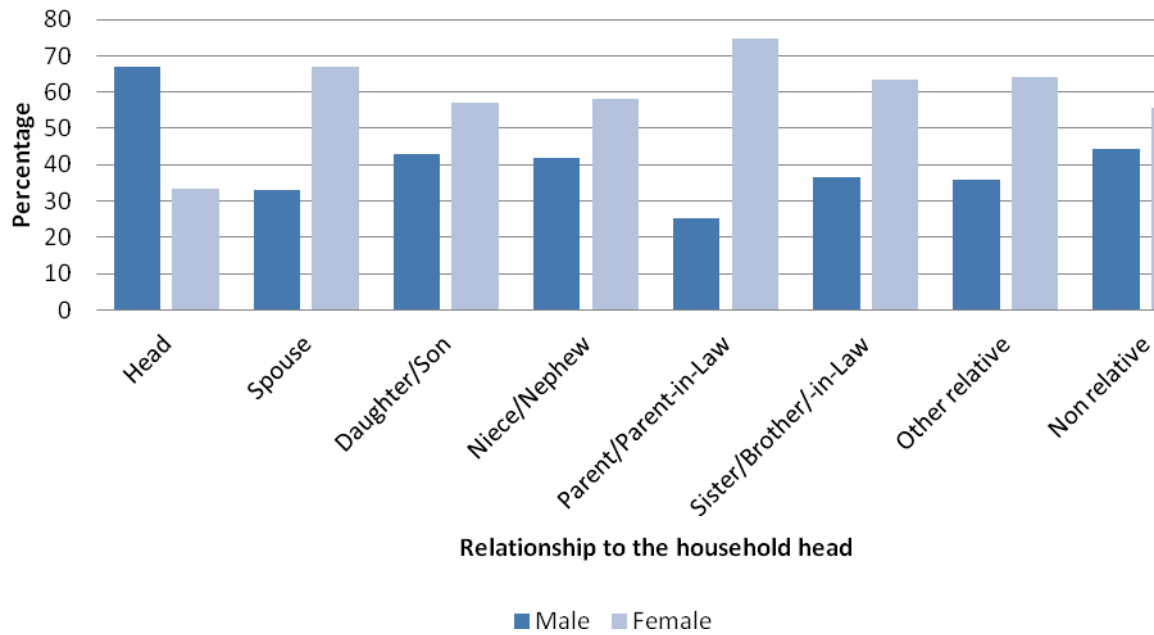

Figure 2.17: Percentage distribution of older persons by disability status by age group

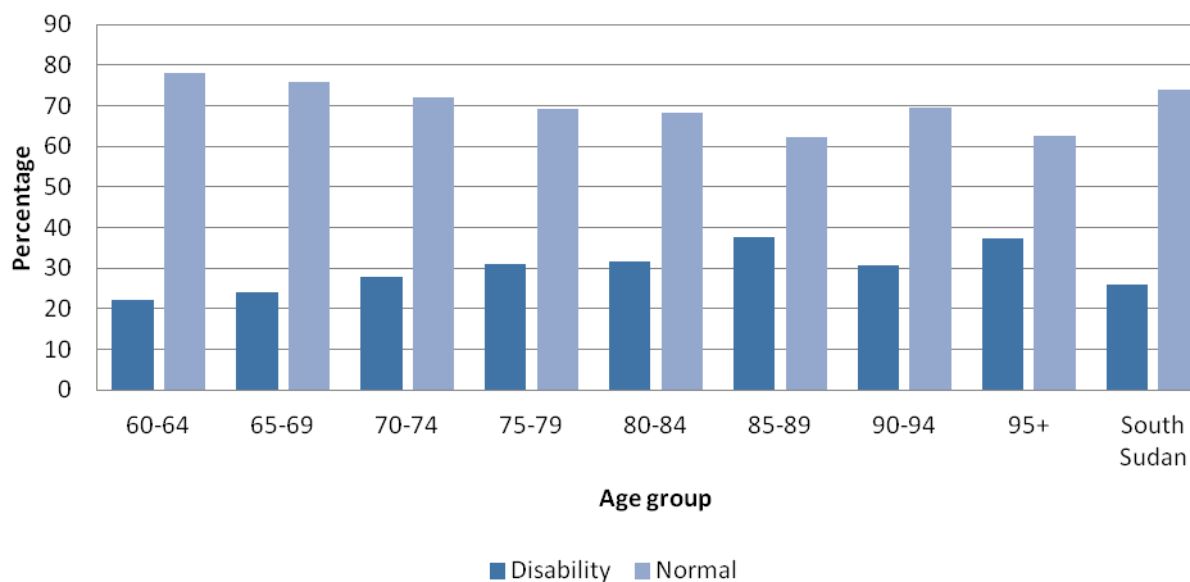

Figure 2.18: Percentage of older persons by type of disability

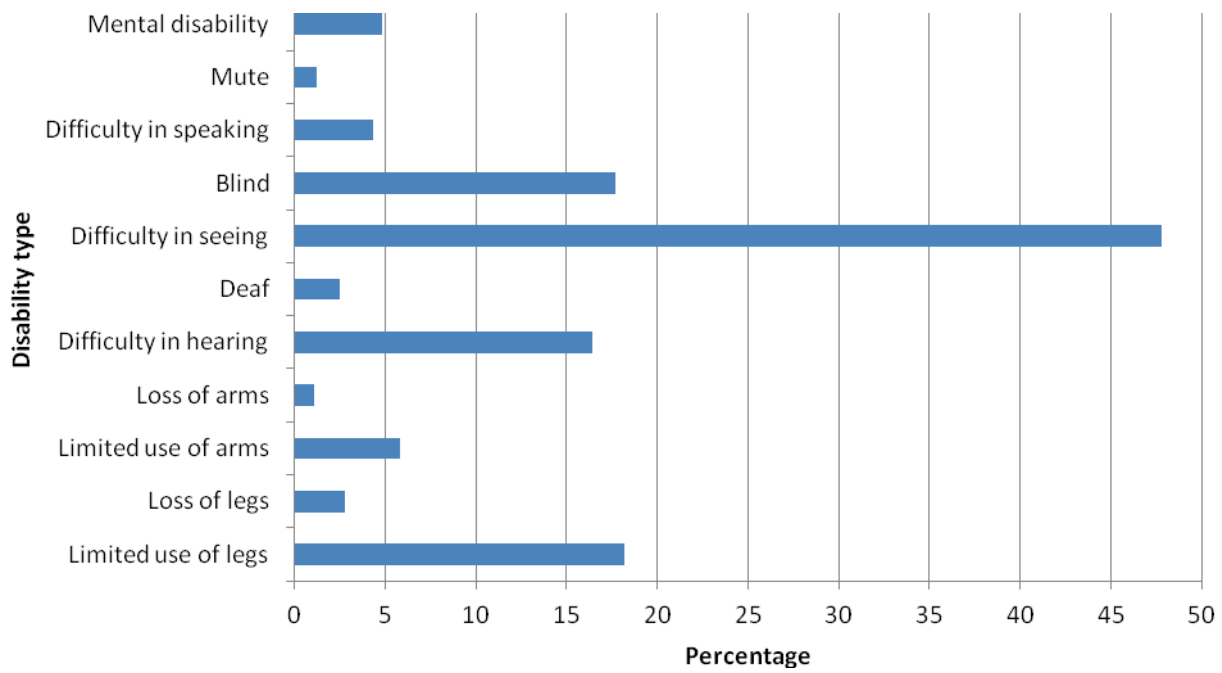
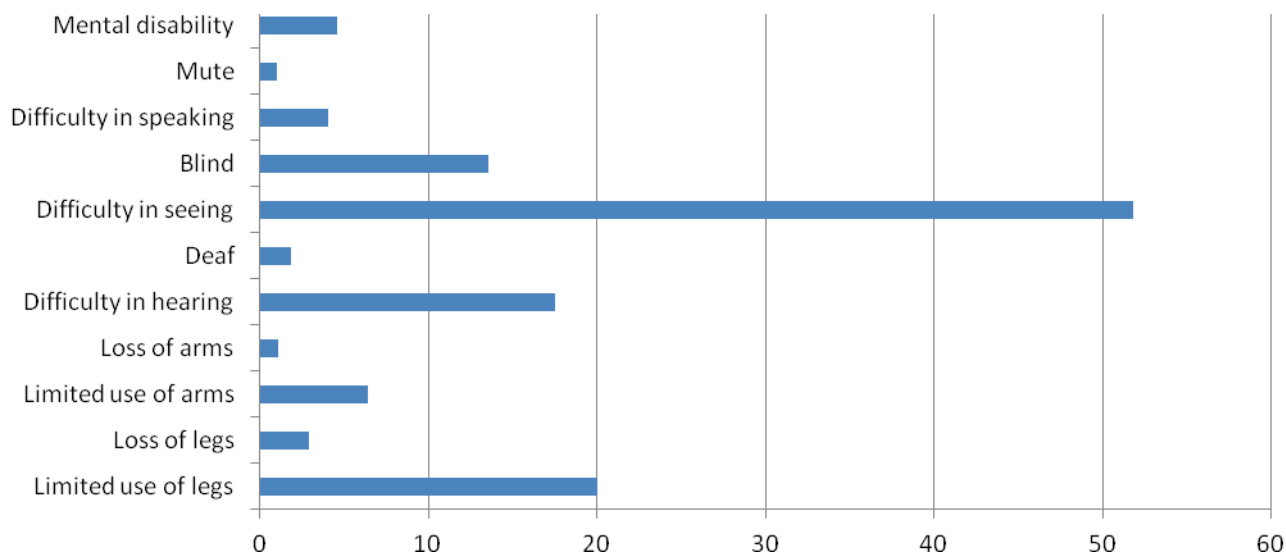

Figure 3.1: Percentage distribution of children under 18 years by literacy rates by state by sex

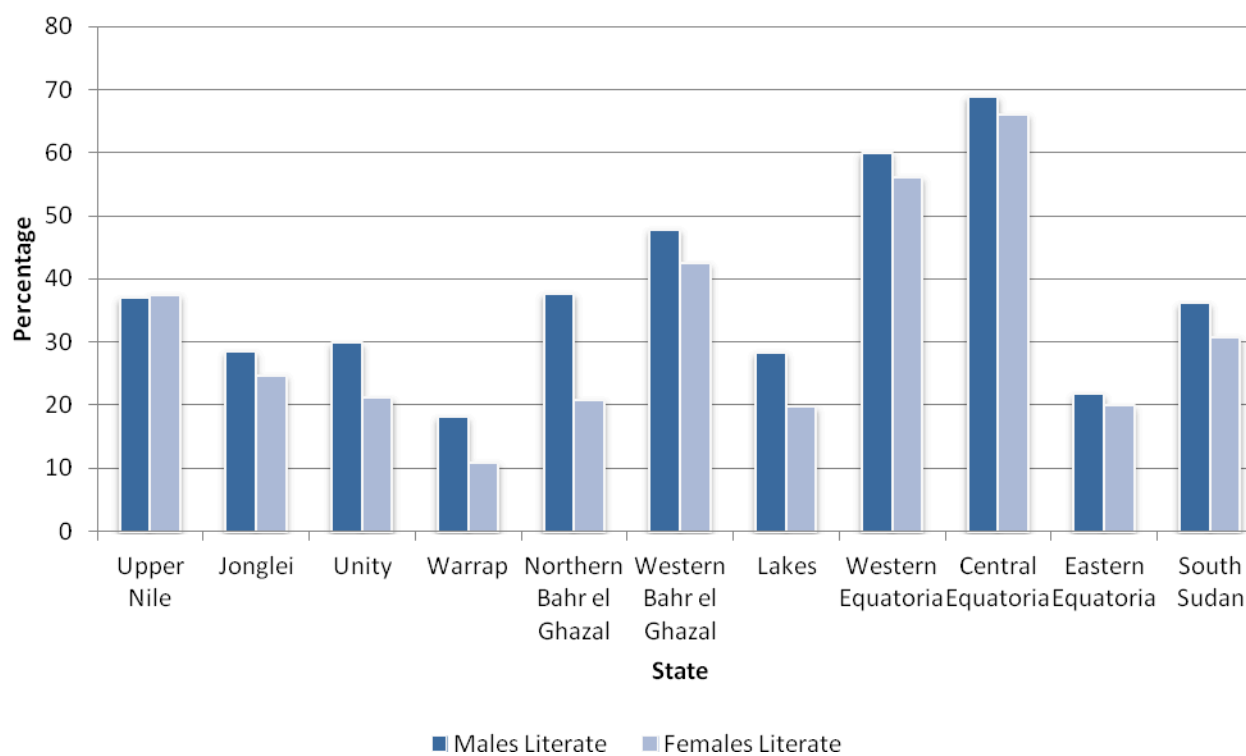

Figure 3.2: Percentage distribution of children by literacy status by age group by sex

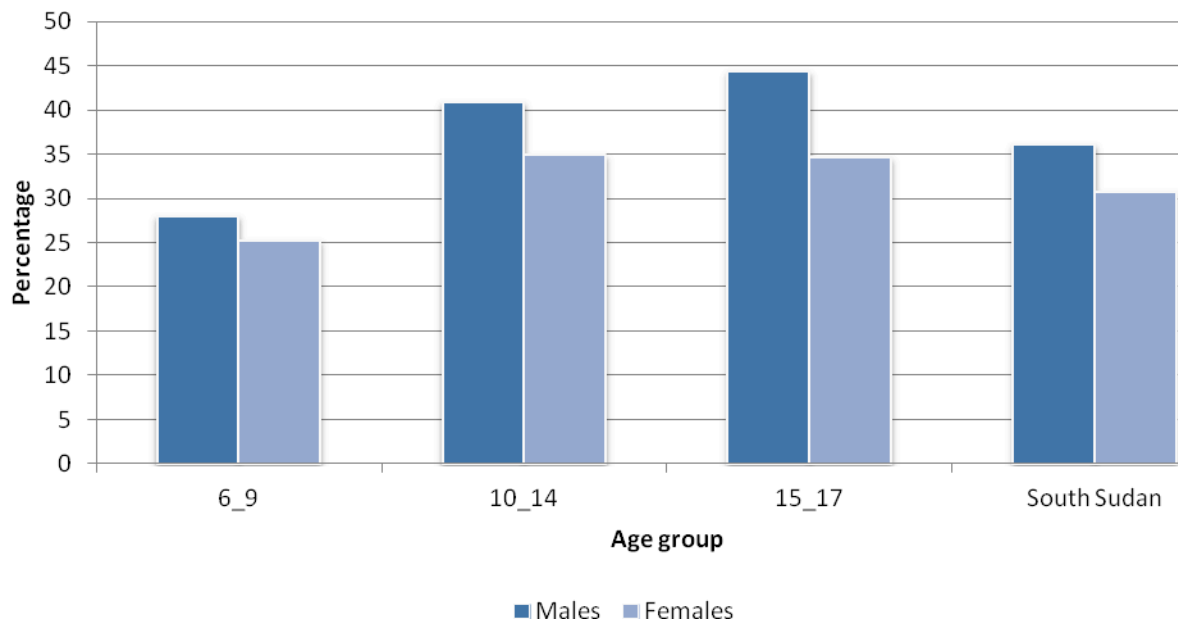

Figure 3.3: Percentage distribution of children 6-17 years by school attendance by sex

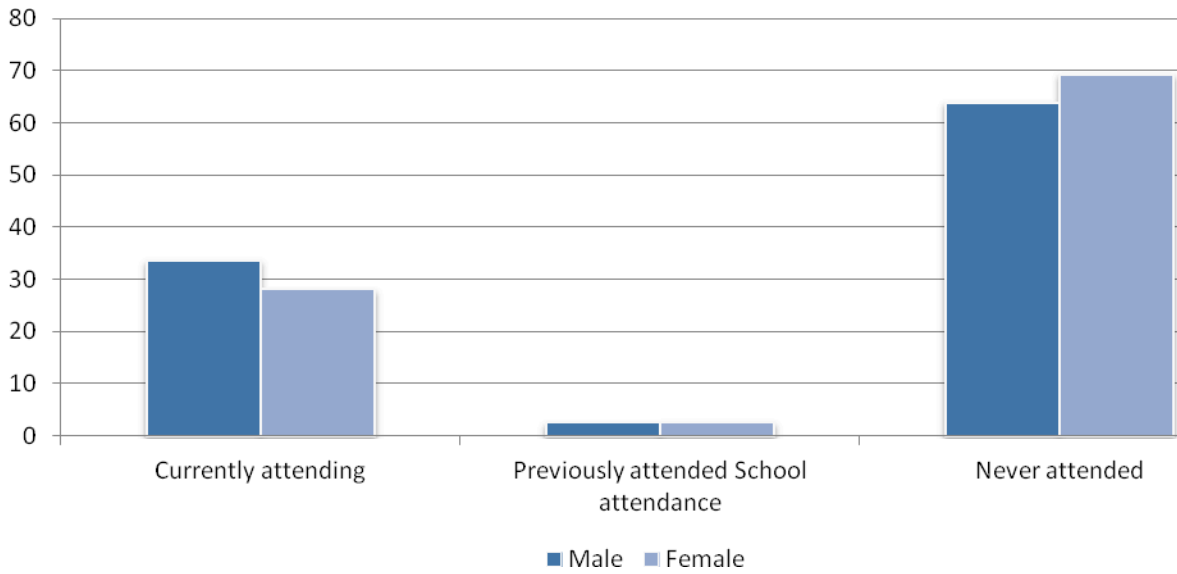

Figure 3.4: Percentage distribution of children by school attendance by age group

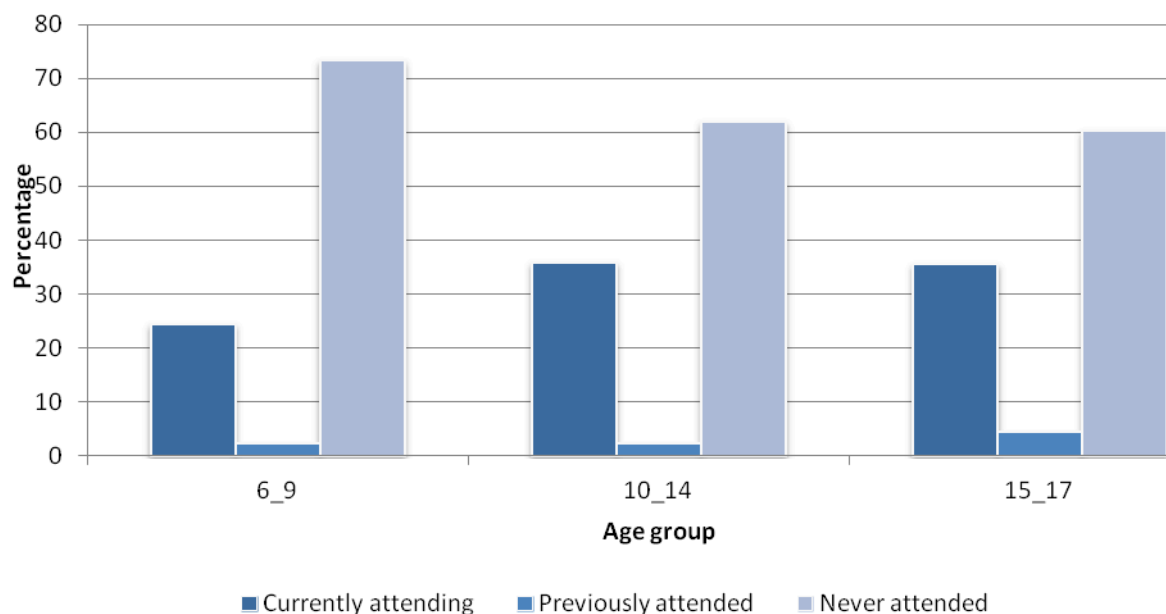

Figure 3.5: Percentage distribution of children by literacy status by orphan hood status by sex

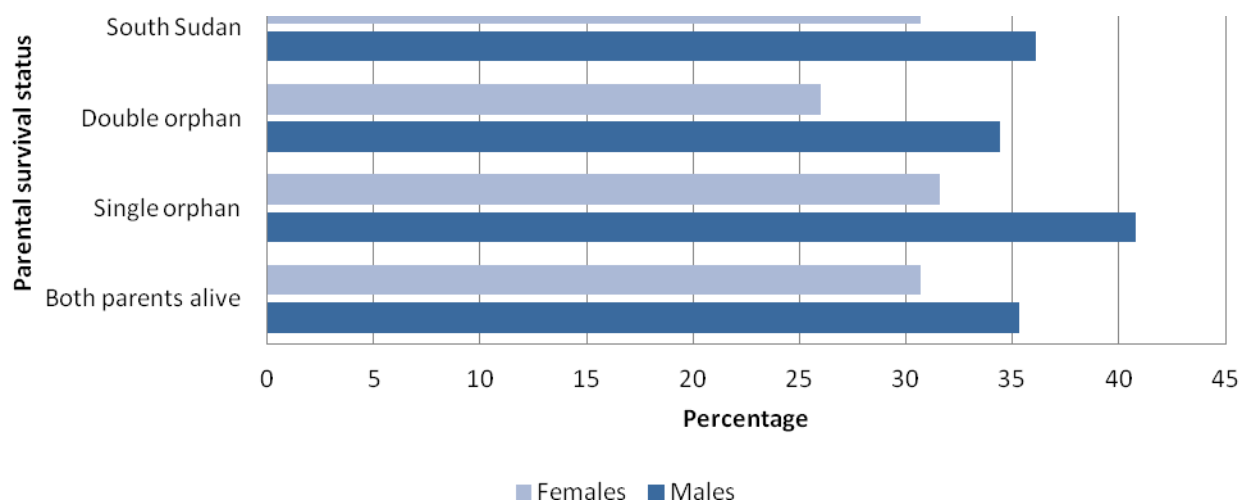

Figure 3.6: Percentage distribution of the population by literacy rates by state by sex

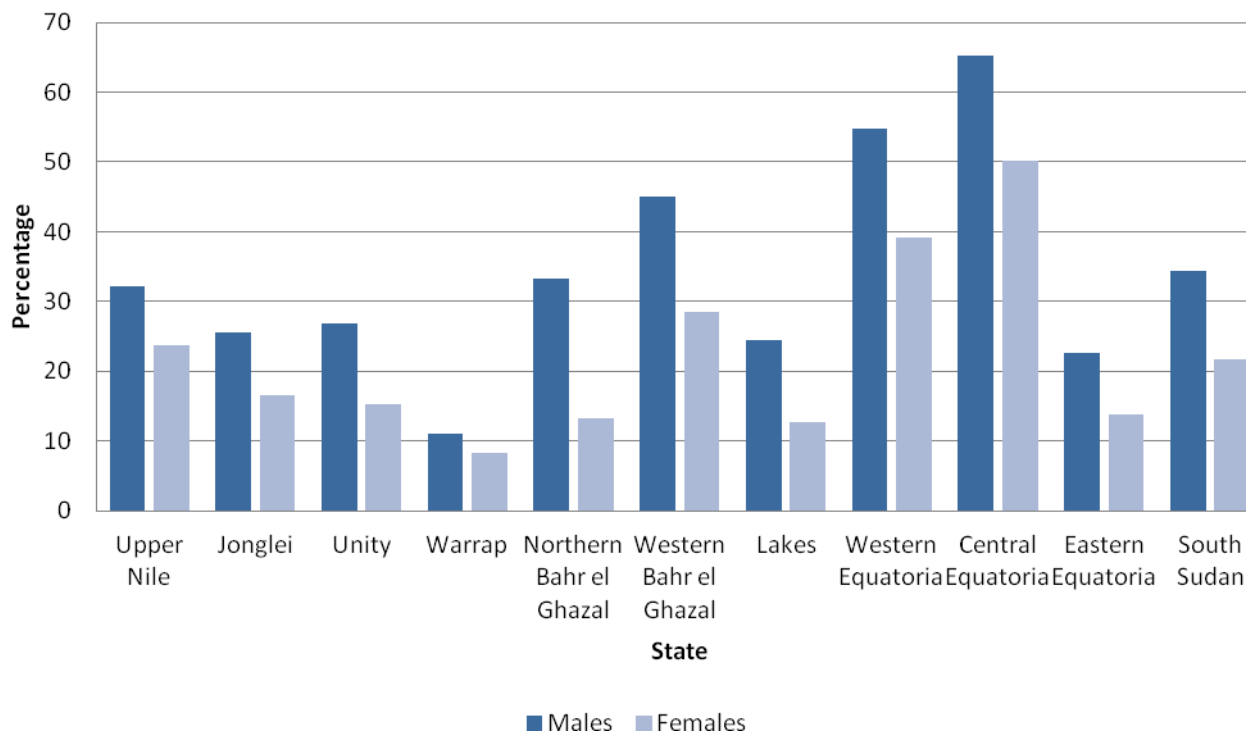

Figure 5.1: Percentages of phone users, not fixed subscribers but mobile subscribers by company are:

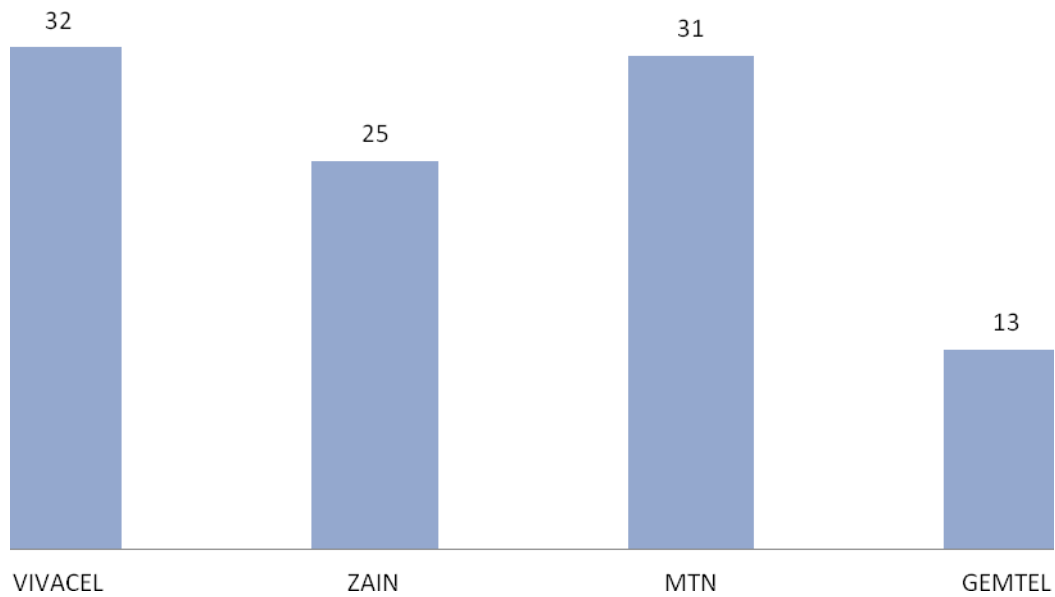

Figure 5.2: Percentages of towns covered by each Mobile phone company

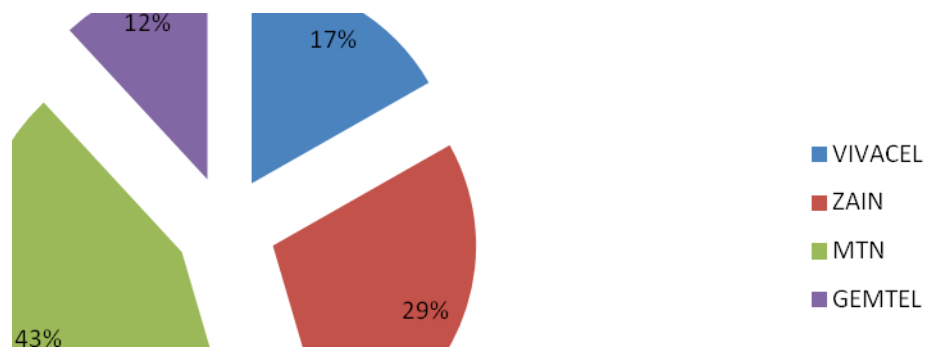

Figure 5.3: Percentage distribution of employed children 10-17 years by employment status

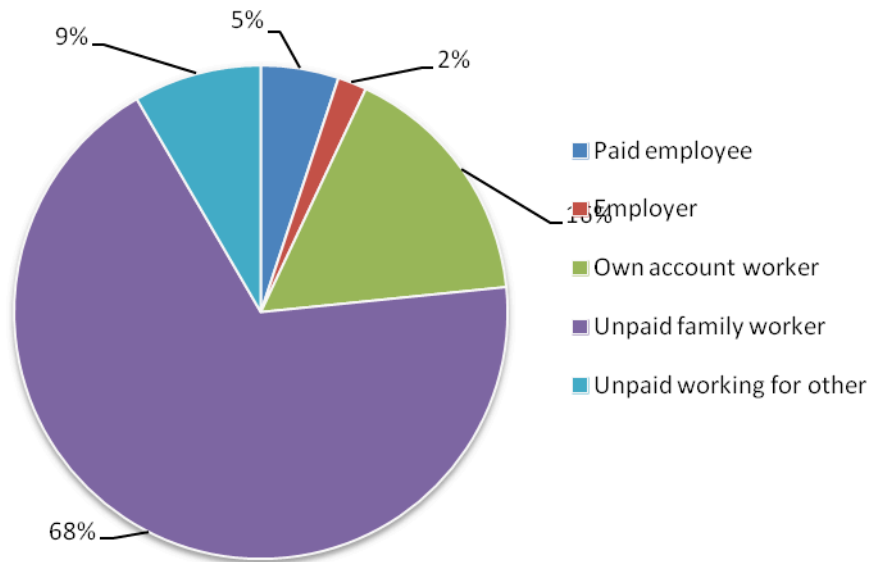
